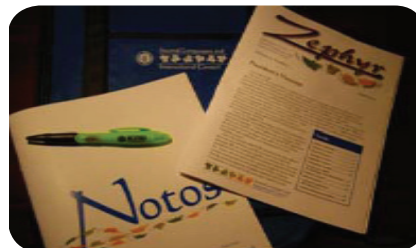

All such members shall be entitled to full privileges of council membership, including the rights to vote and hold office.

Life Membership – Retired members of the ATA are eligible for life membership in the council and are entitled to all the benefits and services of the council membership except the right to hold office.

Student Membership – Student members of the ATA may join this council and are entitled to all the benefits and services of the council membership except the right to hold office.

Subscription Service – Persons or organizations that are ineligible for membership in the ATA (i.e. school support staff, parents, libraries, and non-active teachers) may sign up for a subscription service to receive the council's publications. This fee does not provide access to any other membership services or benefits of this council.
